



Research shows that young people are less likely than other age groups to be aware of their housing rights, understand 'the system' or to be able to afford their own place to live.

Our own experience has shown that this leaves many young people vulnerable to homelessness, exploitation and hardship – and ultimately in a home that doesn't meet their needs.

In response to this, United Welsh and Llamau have developed Tai Ffres, a new housing and support service created with young people, for young people.



## Welsh for 'Fresh Housing', Tai Ffres is being developed and delivered with Welsh Government Innovation Funding.

Through Tai Ffres, young people aged 16 – 25 will:

- Live in genuinely affordable, quality homes with standards set by young people
- Move to connected communities where they can thrive
- Choose who they live with; young couples and parents are welcome
- Receive support from the first point of contact, if they want it
- Lead their support, based on their strengths and the goals they set
- Fulfil their potential with opportunities for education and employment

We are taking a fresh approach to ending youth homelessness by involving young people in all that we do.
